Introduction to Healthcare Pastoral Visitation Course

- Are you a lay person who might be interested in healthcare visitation within your local church context or within a chaplaincy context?
- Are you a lay person who visits healthcare facilities as part of your church responsibilities?
- Do you sometimes feel unsure what to do, what to say or how to react to the different pastoral situations you meet or could meet in a healthcare setting?
- Would you be interested in receiving some training for healthcare pastoral visitors?

Applicants will be asked to complete the relevant application form and give the contact details of their minister/pastor/priest, so a letter of approval and recommendation can be requested. Places will be allocated to successful applicants on a first come, first served basis.

Due to the nature of the course, the maximum number of participants is 12.

The cost of the course, including refreshments and course materials, is £80. If you are successful in obtaining a place on the course, you will be notified by email and sent an invoice for the course fee.
